

2020 West Liberty Labor Day Celebration

COVID-19 Requirements – Excerpted from ODH “Director’s Order” dated July 23, 2020

Additional planning has been devoted to the 2020 West Liberty Labor Day Celebration, intending to follow State and Local Health Department requirements to mitigate the potential spread of COVID-19.

The following is a partial list of requirements, excerpted from the latest order as issued by Ohio Governor Mike DeWine and Lance D. Himes, Interim Director of the Ohio Department of Health (ODH), and is intended as a list of requirements deemed most likely to apply for attendees to this year’s event.

1. **Facial Coverings (Masks).** Except as provided herein, all individuals in the State of Ohio shall wear facial coverings at all times when:
 - a) In any indoor location that is not a residence;
 - b) When outdoors and unable to consistently maintain a distance of six (6) feet or more from individuals who are not members of their family/household
2. **Exceptions.** The requirement to wear a facial covering does not apply when:
 - a) The individual is under ten (10) years of age;
 - b) A medical condition including those with respiratory conditions that restrict breathing, mental health conditions, or disability contraindicates the wearing of a facial covering;
 - c) The individual is communicating or seeking to communicate with someone who is hearing-impaired or has another disability, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication;
 - d) The individual is alone in an enclosed space, such as an office, or in lieu of an enclosed space, the individual is separated by at least six (6) feet in all directions from all other individuals, and in either case the space is not intended for use or access by the public;
 - e) The individual is actively participating in athletic practice, scrimmage, or competition that is permitted under a separate Department of Health order;
 - f) The individual is actively engaged in public safety capacity, including but not limited to law enforcement, firefighters or emergency medical personnel;
 - g) The individual is seated and actively consuming food or beverage in a restaurant or bar,
 - h) Facial coverings are prohibited by law or regulation;
 - i) Facial coverings are in violation of documented industry standards;
 - j) Facial coverings are in violation of a business’s documented safety policies;
 - k) Individual is actively participating in broadcast communications;
 - l) Individual is an officiant of a religious service
3. **Social Distancing Requirements.** For the purpose of the Order, Social Distancing Requirements includes maintaining at least six-foot social distancing from other individuals, washing hands with soap and water for at least twenty seconds as frequently as possible or using hand sanitizer, covering coughs or sneezes (into the sleeve or elbow, not hands), regularly cleaning high-touch surfaces, and not shaking hands.
 - a) **Required measures.** Essential Businesses and Operations and businesses engaged in Minimum Basic Operations must take proactive measures to ensure compliance with Social Distancing Requirements, including where possible:

- i. **Designate six-foot distances.** Designating with signage, tape or by other means six-foot spacing for employees and customers in line to maintain appropriate distance;
- ii. **Hand sanitizer and sanitizing products.** Having hand sanitizer and sanitizing products readily available for employees and customers

Other general requirements. If you are sick or exhibiting any of the symptoms for COVID-19, stay at home or leave the Celebration immediately, while avoiding contact with others.
